Government (U.S. Congress) Service

- 1973-74 Senate Select Committee on Presidential Campaign Activities (Senate Watergate Committee), majority staff assistant. Junior in college, joined the staff, managed the Nixon reelection campaign committee files at the National Archives, ran the "Responsiveness Investigation" of the Committee, Book 18-19 Final Report.
- 1975-76 House Committee on Post Office & Civil Service, ran investigation of Nixon White House abuses of the Civil Service system (Responsiveness Program). This investigation ended the Civil Service Commission which was replaced with the Federal Personnel Management Office.
- 1976-7 House Subcommittee on International Organizations "Koreagate Investigation." Ran international aspect of investigation focused on the CIA, State Department and other international aspects of US-Republic of Korea relationships.

- 1977 *Washington Post*, stringer. Covered the trial of Congressman Otto Passman (D-LA) who had accepted bribes from Korean businessman and agent Tongson Park.
